

THE STUDY: OTR about pilgrimage experiences in Rome

RQ1: Which venues/attractions did independent pilgrims visited in Rome?

map of toponymies

RQ2: Which aspect of the pilgrimage experience did drive them?

identification of pilgrimage drivers

RQ3: Which types of comments and advices did they give about the venues they visited?

argumentative analysis of reviewers' comments









RESULTS – RQ1 Pilgrimage attractions in Rome mentioned more than 5 times



RESULTS – RQ1 Pilgrimage attractions in Rome mentioned from 2 to 4 times



RESULTS – RQ1 Pilgrimage attractions in Rome mentioned only once



RESULTS – RQ2 (Declared) Drivers of pilgrimage

To visit a sacred place

"Saint Agnes is a small catacomb, but it has great interest for the Christian pilgrim." "Wish to visit the 7 Catholic pilgrim churches."

To see tangible signs of faith

[Holy stairs] "These steps (...) are the steps that Jesus walked up when he went before Pilate in Jerusalem prior to His crucifixation."

[St. Peter] "(there are) many incorrupt bodies of popes."

To perform a religious activity

"Prayed briefly at Blessed John Paul II's resting place."

"There was time for prayer, and relishing their Faith heritage."

To attend a religious event

"Being in Rome for the inauguration of Pope Francis."

"Thanksgiving Mass for the Canonization of Kateri Tekakwitha."

RESULTS – RQ3 Pilgrims' arguments – an example

"If you are a Christian, you don't want to miss this. These are the stairs that Jesus walked up and down during his last days in Jerusalem."

Major premise: If an object belonged or was used by a person who is venerated in a religious community, that object deserves special devotion by that community.

Endoxon: Jesus is venerated by Christians as the true God.

Minor premise: The Holy Stairs were used by Jesus.

Conclusion: Christians should visit the Holy Stairs.

CONCLUSIONS

UGC REPORTING PILGRIMAGE EXPERIENCES TO ROME

- > the 4 patriarchal basilicas are top pilgrimage venues
- > St. Sebastian and St. Lawrence outside the walls were never mentioned as pilgrimage shrines, the Holy Cross in Jerusalem just once
- ➤ a number of other different religious attractions were mentioned; they mostly host tangible signs of faith

CONCLUSIONS II

PILGRIMAGE EXPERIENCES IN PLATFORMS FOR TRAVEL REVIEW

A small number of relevant results were retrieved, presumably because platforms:

- → impose a 'product-oriented' publish method
- → are mostly used to give logistic advice and descriptions than to share personal experiences

- ➤ Analysis of different types of UGC: travel blogs and travel diaries + OTR of guided tours
- ➤ Analysis of arguments given for the 4 pilgrimage drivers → focus on *endoxa*
