

Adine Gavazzi

Swiss architect of the Politecnico of Milan, specialized in Anthropology of the Andes and the Amazon, researches Forest Cultures, Healing Landscapes and pre-Hispanic and indigenous Ceremonial Architectures. She worked on the Peruvian Coast of Cahuachi, Ventarrón and Chaparrí, on the Andean mountains of Ollantaytambo, WHS Machu Picchu and Tiahuanaco, in the Amazon of Mayantuyacu and in the Cloud Forest of Abiseo. Her field Technomorphology structured a theoretical discipline and a methodology to analyze both archaeological Heritage and Living Cultures and produced projects also in WHS of Chauvet in France, Sacri Monti and Etna in Italy and Borobudur, Indonesia. Founding member of the UNESCO Chair “Anthropology of Health” of the University of Genoa, Italy and Professor of University Pedro Ruiz Gallo of Lambayeque, Peru, she is also director for the Cultural component of the Rio Abiseo Expedition on the Mixed WHS Río Abiseo. Adine authored numerous monographs, among which *Arquitectura Andina – formas e historia de los espacios sagrados*, *Microcosmos – visión andina de los espacios prehispánicos* and *Lima – memoria prehispánica de la traza urbana*.
